Originally from Buffalo, New York, Bob Koch served in the United States Navy aboard the USS Suribachi as a serviceman on an ammunition ship. Over his 46-year tenure with us, Bob has gotten involved with many activities, including painting a large mural of the American flag in our shipping area to honor those who serve in the U.S. military.
